blanket *n* (13) a thick, warm cover that you sleep under

get on well with someone *v* (49) to like and be friendly to someone

get together *v* (49) to meet in order to do something or spend time together

grateful *adj* (53) feeling or showing thanks

habit *n* (53) something that you do regularly, almost without thinking about it

jealousy *n* (48) jealous feelings

keen *adj* (49) wanting to do something very much

mean *adj* (53) A mean person does not like spending money, especially on other people.

miserable *adj* (53) unhappy

move away *v* (48) to go to a different place to live

negative *adj* (53) a negative effect is bad and causes damage to something; not having enthusiasm or positive opinions about something

pocket *n* (63) a small bag that is sewn or fixed onto or into a piece of clothing, a bag, the back of a seat, etc.

purse *n* (63) a small container for money, usually used by a woman

quiz show *n* (58) a television or radio programme in which you answer questions

review *n* (59) a report in a newspaper, magazine, or programme that gives an opinion about a new book, film, etc.

round neck *n* (63) an opening for your neck on a piece of clothing which is in the shape of a circle

sleeve *n* (63) the part of a jacket, shirt, etc. that covers your arm

sleeveless *adj* (63) describes a piece of clothing with no sleeves

striped *adj* (63) with a pattern of stripes (a long, straight area of colour)

subtitles *n* (61) words shown at the bottom of a cinema or television screen to explain what is being said

mild *adj* (68) When weather is mild, it is less cold than you would expect.

on time *prep* (73) not early or late

overnight *adv* (73) for or during the night

path *n* (72) a long, narrow area of ground for people to walk along

pedestrian *n* (72) a person who is walking and not travelling in a vehicle

railroad *n* (73) the metal tracks that trains travel on (US)

rider *n* (72) someone who rides a horse, bicycle or motorcycle

scooter *n* (74) a small motorcycle

season *n* (70) one of the four periods of the year; winter, spring, summer, or autumn

shower *n* (68) a short period of rain

signpost *n* (73) a sign by the side of the road that gives information about routes and distances

stormy *adj* (69) If it is stormy, the weather is bad with a lot of wind and rain.

suitcase *n* (71) a rectangular case with a handle that you use for carrying clothes when you are travelling

take off *v* (68) If an aircraft takes off, it begins to fly.

thunderstorm *n* (68) a storm that has thunder (= loud noise) and lightning

hyphen *n* (86) a mark (-) used to join two words together, or to show that a word has been divided and continues on the next line

lazy *adj* (83) Someone who is lazy does not like working or using any effort.

make up *v* (80) to say or write something that is not true

nephew *n* (78) the son of your brother or sister, or the son of your husband's or wife's brother or sister

plain *adj* (82) A plain person is not attractive to look at.

reliable *adj* (83) able to be trusted or believed

rude *adj* (83) behaving in a way which is not polite and upsets other people

scar *n* (82) a permanent mark left on the body from a cut or other injury

selfish *adj* (83) caring only about yourself and not other people

set up *v* (79) to start a company or organisation

shy *adj* (83) not confident, especially about meeting or talking to new people

smart *adj* (83) intelligent

sort out *v* (79) to successfully deal with something, such as a problem or difficult situation

ice hockey *n* (92) a game played on ice in which two teams try to hit a small hard object into a goal using long curved sticks

injure *v* (89) to hurt a person, animal, or part of your body

jogging *n* (92) running slowly for exercise

medicine *n* (89) a substance used to cure an illness or injury

net *n* (92) something made with a piece of net (= material made of crossed threads with holes between them), for example for sports

nurse *n* (89) someone whose job is to care for ill and injured people

operation *n* (89) when a doctor cuts someone's body to remove or repair part of it

pill *n* (89) a small, hard piece of medicine that you swallow

pitch *n* (92) an area of ground where a sport is played

racket *n* (92) a piece of equipment that you use to hit a ball in sports such as tennis

score *v* (92) to get points in a game or test

sore throat *n* (89) pain in the back part of your mouth and the passages inside your neck

- ask** *v* (120) to say something to someone as a question which you want them to answer
- ask for** *v* (120) to say something to someone because you want them to give you something
- behind** *prep* (124) at or to the back of someone or something
- between** *prep* (124) in the space that separates two places, people, or things
- communicate** *v* (125) to share information with others by speaking, writing, moving your body, or using other signals
- communication** *n* (120) the act of communicating with other people
- dork** *n* (118) a stupid or silly person
- dude** *n* (118) a man
- geek** *n* (118) a man who is boring and not fashionable
- graffiti** *n* (118) writing or pictures painted on walls and public places, usually illegally
- in front of** *prep* (124) close to the front part of something
- inside** *prep* (124) in or into a room, building, container, etc.
- joke** *n* (120) something which someone says to make people laugh, usually a short story with a funny ending
- lie** *n* (120) something that you say or write which you know is not true
- Martian** *n* (118) in stories, someone from the planet Mars
- next to** *prep* (124) very close to something or someone, with nothing in between
- on the right** *prep* (124) on or towards the part of your body that is to the east when you are facing north
- opposite** *prep* (124) in a position facing something or someone but on the other side
- over** *prep* (124) above or higher than something
- raise money** *v* (120) to collect money from other people
- say** *v* (118) to speak words
- slang** *n* (118) informal language, often language that is only used by people who belong to a particular group
- speak** *v* (119) to say something using your voice
- story** *n* (120) a description of a series of real or imaginary events which is intended to entertain people
- talk** *v* (120) to say things to someone
- tell** *v* (120) to say something to someone, usually giving them information
- truth** *n* (120) the quality of being true
- wonder** *v* (123) to want to know something or to try to understand the reason for something
